Noted that this has been a lot of work to ensure consistency across the data going forward. Points to note: Referral rates continue to be unpredictable depending on pressures and different stages of lockdowns etc. Waiting lists continue to rise. Services are using staff members from other areas to manage waiting lists Most services are offering both face to face and virtual appointments. Services will continue to work on a blended approach for the foreseeable future. Staff numbers continue to be an issue due to self- isolation and issues around recruitment. Penny Turnbull reported that referral numbers are up in St Andrew's University. New FRASAC worker has been in post for almost 6 months. Penny will report back to FVAWP to show level of demand. Challenges around young people not seeing themselves as being in an 'abusive relationship' 	Noted

	Saje Scotland Sheila reported that Saje Scotland have funding only until the end of May 2022. Their funding application to the DESF for £380,000 was unsuccessful. They have applied for funding via the Victim Centre Support Funds but won't hear about that until March 2022	It was recognised that if Saje folds it will leave a gap in services in Fife.		
	They have applied for funding from several places, only being successful in getting small amounts.			
	They have been lobbying local papers, MPs etc to try and raise awareness that the service will not be available from June 2022 if no funding is found			
	Delivering Equally Safe Fund (report circulated) Sheila reported on the services in Fife who were successful in their funding bids to the DESF.			
	Funding has been cut from 3 years to 2 years. Funding has been received for core work only.	DESF has been widely criticised for cutting funding from 3 to 2 years. Jan highlighted the challenges of short-term funding		
	Sheila also reported that Lesley Irving has been appointed as an Independent Chair to undertake a strategic review of funding and commissioning.	Sheila to attend a VAW network round table event 10/02/22		
	Venture Trust (correction to report) Funded by DESF across all local authorities in Scotland via their Next Steps Programme which works with women facing significant disadvantage. It provides both primary and secondary prevention of VAWG through overcoming the underlying circumstances that lead to women's increased vulnerability and inequality. Scottish Government are keen to roll this out across Scotland soon to include VAW There were a number of concerns raised at the meeting. 	It was agreed Sheila would draft a statement based on discussion and circulate for further comment around the FVAWP executive before feeding back to VAW / Scottish Govt and CoSLA. The following was submitted: FVAWP had the opportunity to discuss the use of restorative justice in situations of domestic abuse, sexual violence and other forms of violence against women at our meeting 01 February 2022. Partners are united in their view that it is of great concern. We understand:		

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		 that safety and wellbeing are intended to underpin the proposals from the Scottish Government and Community Justice Scotland in developing restorative practice. the value of restorative justice and the principles that support it some survivors of VAW have said they would welcome the option of restorative justice However, Fife VAW Partnership consider that the risks involved, as highlighted at the Roundtable on restorative justice in November 2021 outweigh any potential benefits. We believe that there are many survivors who would be put at risk by restorative practice in terms of: 		
		 re-traumatisation, perpetrators using the opportunity to further control, intimidate and coerce victims / survivors survivors feeling they "ought" to agree to restorative practice lack of expertise to safely manage such high-risk consequences lack of resources to develop and maintain such a complex process (and should this be our priority?) We also believe that there is a significant body of survivors who are strongly opposed to this proposal. Third sector colleagues participating in this discussion highlighted ways that perpetrators currently abuse 		

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			systems such as child contact to harass, intimidate and further abuse their victims.
